Announcing the 2023 Global Best Of Wine Tourism Award Winners, and the start of public voting for the People's Choice Awards.

Today, the Great Wine Capitals Network celebrates industry innovation with the announcement of the 11 Global Best Of Wine Tourism Awards. The 11 winners of the Global Best Of Wine Tourism Awards were announced at Great Wine Capitals Annual Gala event in Mendoza (Argentina) on November 3rd 2022, representing the best of the best wine tourism businesses from the most prestigious wine regions across five continents.

Since 2003, the Great Wine Capitals' Best Of Wine Tourism Awards have shone a light on the quality craftmanship of wine tourism businesses in Adelaide (South Australia), Bilbao | Rioja (Spain), Bordeaux (France), Cape Town | Cape Winelands (South Africa), Lausanne (Switzerland), Mainz | Rheinhessen (Germany), Mendoza (Argentina), Porto (Portugal), San Francisco | Napa Valley (USA), Valparaiso | Casablanca Valley (Chile) and Verona (Italy).

This year the Best Of Wine Tourism Awards received 545 applications globally with 75 regional awards distributed. An expert international jury awarded a Global Best Of Wine Tourism Award per member city to the 11 most exceptional businesses:

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Profiles – Our 11 Global Best Of Wine Tourism Award Winners

The Great Wine Capital Network congratulates the 11 winners of the 2023 Global Best Of Wine Tourism Award. Each winner is also listed among 75 eligible finalists for the People's Choice Awards, which will open for public voting from the 7th of November.

Adelaide, South Australia | Grapes for Good – Zoos SA

Launched in November 2021, Grapes for Good is a partnership between six leading Langhorne Creek wine producers and Zoos SA which supports the conservation efforts underway at nearby Monarto Safari Park. Each winery stop provides a unique experience for visitors to enjoy, including gin and wine flights at Bremerton, Meechi brewing at the Winehouse, the award-winning restaurant at Lake Breeze, the rooftop viewing deck at Kimbolton Wines, Fleurieu Chocolate and luxury skin products at Vineyard Road and visiting the 1892 red gum press at Bleasdale Wines. To date, the Grapes for Good wine trail has donated over \$30,000 to help endangered species at the Monarto Safari Park.

Grapes for Good also won the 2023 Best Of Wine Tourism Award for Innovative Wine Tourism Experiences in its region.

Bilbao – Rioja, Spain | Marqués de Murrieta

Marqués de Murrieta has established itself as one of the world's most idyllic wine tourism destinations. The Cebrián-Sagarriga family successfully transformed the oldest industrial buildings in Europe into a boasting example of balance, elegance and modernity. After six years of construction, the new winery was inaugurated in 2022, emphasising an admirable harmony with the historical-architectural complex of the Ygay Castle. The new winery consists of a group of buildings of more than 25,000 m2 for the production and aging of its wines, surrounded by more than 50,000 m2 of new parks and gardens. The winery contributes in an extraordinary way to the prestige of the Bilbao-Rioja wine tourism destination.

Marqués de Murrieta also won the 2023 Best Of Wine Tourism Award for Architecture & Landscape excellence in its region.

Bordeaux, France | Château Fleur de Lisse

Nestled in the heart of landscapes listed as World Heritage by UNESCO, Château Fleur de Lisse cultivates its vines using organic and biodynamic farming practices. From vine to bottle, wine production testifies to virtuous and demanding commitment. Know-how and knowledge sharing are part of the Château's DNA. The estate promotes soft mobility. Vegetation is planted between the vine rows. Birdhouses increase biodiversity. Compost and infusions boost the vines. Visitors are taken through an educational journey with interactive maps to help them better understand the philosophy and methods behind the winery's sustainable viticulture. Further, workshops are conducted allowing visitors to taste locally inspired delights whilst taking part in a variety of sensory experiences to appreciate wine with a renewed pleasure.

Château Fleur de Lisse also won the 2023 Best Of Wine Tourism Award for Sustainable Wine Tourism Practices excellence in its region.

Cape Town – Cape Winelands, South Africa | Weltevrede

Since 1912, the Jonker family has called Weltevrede home. As the winery's grape production escalated, the Jonker family increased the size of the Weltevrede winery, all whilst maintaining the original vines from the estate's founder. Nearly just as much as the soil itself, Weltevrede loves the family experience and the close-knit sharing of the soil's feel. Each vine, each delectable grape berry, and each succeeding wine are built on this anchor of Weltevrede, which is rooted in time itself. The winery showcases 72 distinct vineyards, some of which are smaller than half a hectare. They can be broadly categorised into three separate soil types, or terroirs, including alluvial soil, rust-coloured limestone, and shattered shale rock.

Weltevrede also won the 2023 Best Of Wine Tourism Awards for Innovative Wine Tourism experiences and Architecture and Landscape excellence in its region.

Lausanne, Switzerland | La Vigne Swiss Wine Therapy

La Vigne offers a unique, immersive and exclusive well-being treatment experience amongst the vineyards of Lauvaux, through its mobile pop-up spa Bubble tent. While allowing its visitors to enjoy one of the most amazing panoramas in the world (UNESCO World Heritage), the experience promotes the recycling of vine residues – which are usually thrown away or composted by the winemaker. Further to its wellbeing treatments and spectacular views, guests can indulge in wine tasting, local gastronomy and hospitality as they enjoy a unique and exclusive experience.

La Vigne Swiss Wine Therapy also won the 2023 Best Of Wine Tourism Award for Sustainable Wine and Tourism Practices excellence in its region.

Mendoza, Argentina | Anaia Wines

The impeccable design of Anaia Wines is inspired by the land and landscape of Mendoza: mountains, flora, texture and colours of ancient rocks in earthy tones that responds to different strata that were sedimented through thousands of years. The winery showcases itself as a rectangular prism of 11 mts wide by 100 mts long where different sectors follow one another in a linear way, that is: Harvest Sector, Fermentation Warehouse and Expedition Gallery. On the upper floor is the Tourism Sector, where guests are exposed to a panoramic view of the Andes Mountains and a balcony overlooking the Tank and Barrel Room. The form, function, integration into the landscape, passive thermal control, economy of water and energy resources, translate into an austere elegance.

Anaia Wines also won the 2023 Best Of Wine Tourism Award for Architecture and Landscape excellence in its region.

Verona, Italy | Pieropan

The new "Leonildo Pieropan" wine cellar is perfectly nestled in Soave hills, so much so that it became its part and parcel. Visitors can experience a tour of the innovative and futuristic building, guided by a specialised staff, to discover the history of the Pieropan family, winemakers for four generations. The wide structure of the wine cellar is perfectly integrated into the environment and completely hidden under the hill with the exception of the front. The various workspaces inside are set up in harmony with the phases of winemaking and are characterized by elements that create engaging suggestions and emotions. The external space is surrounded by vineyards, including experimental ones.

Pieropan also won the 2023 Best Of Wine Tourism Award for Architecture and Landscape excellence in its region.

Valparaíso – Casablanca Valley, Chile | Matetic Winery

Located in the Rosario Valley, between the coastal valleys of Casablanca and San Antonia is the biodynamic boutique winery – Matetic Winery. Their first vines were planted in 1999 and are found on the slopes of this protected environment, making them pioneers in cold climate Syrah production in Chile. Since its inception, Viña Matetic has been characterised by its organic and biodynamic practice in producing wines. The recently incorporated tour allows visitors to engage in an educational journey where they can learn the entire process of the terroir, the cultivation of the grapes and the natural processes that surround the viticultural processes of its wines. An entire experience and philosophy that reflects the identity of Matetic and that today can be lived, understood and learned.

Matetic Winery also won the 2023 Best Of Wine Tourism Award for Sustainable Wine and Tourism Practices excellence in its region.
